



PRESERVING O'AHU HISTORICAL TSUNAMI PHOTOS

hit in 1946, 1952, 1957, 1960 and 1964?*

*Waves over 30 feet high hit the North Shore, Wai'anae,
and East O'ahu during the April 1, 1946 Aleutian Islands tsunami*
