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## **First Local Tsunami Statewide Exercise Set for April 1**

A simulated 7.6 earthquake on the Big Island is the cornerstone of the first ever statewide local tsunami drill held in Hawaii. Officials from NOAA's Richard H. Hagemeyer Pacific Tsunami Warning Center will initiate the practice session at 11:15 a.m. on April 1. The exercise will end at 11:53 a.m. The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) is an agency of the Commerce Department.

Major players in the exercise include the National Weather Service Honolulu Forecast Office (HFO), Hawaii State Civil Defense, all county civil defense agencies, and state and county warning points. All of the activities – including issuance of a warning, activation of the Emergency Alert System, sounding of sirens – will be invisible to the public. The simulated operations will test Hawaii's ability to respond to a locally generated tsunami and provide an opportunity for officials to review procedures.
