Subject : Invitation to the Twenty-fifth Session of the Intergovernmental Coordination Group for the Pacific Ocean Tsunami Warning and Mitigation System (ICG/PTWS-XXV, Vladivostok, Russian Federation, 11–13 September 2013)

The IOC Assembly at its fourth session (3–12 November 1965) decided through Resolution IV-6, to create the International Coordination Group for the Tsunami Warning System in the Pacific (ICG/ITSU). ICG/ITSU was subsequently renamed by the IOC Executive Council at its thirty-ninth session (Resolution XXXIX-8), the Intergovernmental Coordination Group for the Pacific Tsunami Warning and Mitigation System (ICG/PTWS). In this connection, I am pleased to invite you to nominate a delegation to attend the Twenty-fifth Session of ICG/PTWS scheduled in Vladivostok, Russian Federation, from 11 to 13 September 2013 at the kind invitation of the Government of the Russian Federation. **Please communicate in writing the names and positions of your representatives to the Executive Secretary of the IOC, Ms Wendy Watson-Wright, and register contact details directly on the website at www.ioc-unesco.org/ptws-25 no later than 11th July 2013.** For queries about registration please contact the ICG/PTWS Secretariat at ptws@unesco.org.

In association with this meeting, the Government of the Russian Federation, the International Union of Geodesy and Geophysics (IUGG) Tsunami Commission and UNESCO/IOC are organizing a workshop on ***“Forecasting the tsunami wave impact on coastal territories”***, that will take place on **9–10 September 2013** immediately preceding the ICG/PTWS session.

In the context of the ICG/PTWS session, the Intergovernmental Coordination Group will elect its Officers, namely one Chair and three Vice-chairs for the next biennium, in accordance with the procedure attached in Annex 2. Nominations shall be accepted until end of business the first day of the ICG/PTWS-XXV session and can also be addressed in advance to the IOC Executive Secretary.

I wish to remind you that, according to IOC Resolution XXXIX-8, the membership of the ICG/PTWS consist of:

- Member States of the IOC within and bordering the Pacific Ocean and adjacent seas;
- Observers from other IOC Member States.
- Invited observers from other organizations (including NGOs), programmes and projects, in accordance with the IOC rules and procedures.

The meeting agenda is technical in nature and delegates should be prepared to participate in the technical discussions. A copy of the tentative agenda and provisional timetable is appended to this invitation. **The working languages of the meeting will be English, French and Spanish.**

Details of the venue, information on hotel reservations and general information about the meeting location will be posted and updated on the session website at <http://www.ioc-tsunami.org/ptws-25>. **As in previous intergovernmental meetings Member States are required to self-fund their representatives.**

I am pleased to invite national written reports, including a summary of your future plans, as this would aid the development of the PTWS Implementation Plan. In this view a template for national reports is provided to you in Annex 3. I invite you to send your national reports to the Secretariat no later than 11th July 2013.

Finally, I would like to remind those who have not done so, to please forward contact details for your country's designated Tsunami Warning Focal Point (TWFP) and Tsunami National Contact (TNC) as soon as possible to Mr Bernardo Aliaga at b.aliaga@unesco.org. Please note that these nominations must be validated by your Permanent Delegation to UNESCO/National Commission for UNESCO or Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

ANNEX 2

Elections of the Officers of the ICG

The Twenty-fifth Session of the Intergovernmental Coordination Group for the Pacific Ocean Tsunami Warning and Mitigation System, Vladivostok, Russian Federation, 11-13 September 2013, shall elect the Officers of the ICG, namely, one Chairperson and three Vice-chairpersons, for the term September 2013–September 2015.

The Chairperson shall declare the opening and closing of each session, direct the discussions and ensure observance of the Rules of Procedure, accord the right to speak, put questions to the vote and announce decisions. The Chairperson shall rule on points of order and, subject to these Rules, shall control the proceedings and maintain order and shall strive to work by consensus (Rule 38).

The Vice-chairpersons assist the Chairman in his/her functions and substitute him/her where necessary.

The Chairperson and the Vice-chairpersons of a Subsidiary Body shall not remain in his/her mandate more than two successive terms (as this is the limit established for an IOC Chairperson, Rule 17.2. The time limit of a mandate is two years according to Article 7.2 of the IOC Statutes).

Nominations

Nominations of individuals to either the post of Chairperson or the posts of Vice-chairpersons shall be submitted by Member States through the officially designated Head of Delegation to the ICG/PTWS-XXV, or through the IOC Focal Point in the Member State or the Permanent Delegation to UNESCO.

Nominations shall be submitted in writing to the Executive Secretary using **Form A** (Chairperson) or **Form B** (Vice-chairperson) and must reach the Executive Secretary or his representative on the first day of the meeting by close of business.

Each nomination shall contain a declaration from the candidate that he/she is prepared to stand for the post for which has been nominated and is willing to take on the obligations that would devolve upon him/her, should he/she be elected. Each nomination shall also contain a CV with the profile of the candidate (**Form C**).

Each candidate must be seconded by two Member States of the ICG/PTWS other than the nominating Member State.

Elections

The IOC general practice is working and deciding by consensus (Rule 38.2).

Should voting be necessary, decisions shall be made by a simple majority of the members present and voting (Rule 43.1), by secret ballot.
